## The Diary of Charles Dowman

Two topics dominate each entry in the Dowman Diary. Weather and Labor. Work is and always has been, never ending for a farmer. Thanksgiving Day, Nov. 30, 1905, Charles notes "went out after dinner to buy nails and boots" and then went to work on his corn crib. The holiday didn't interfere with his usual routine. The weather often did. He planned his workday around the conditions outside. And this would be the first thing he wrote about.

Illness was wide spread before vaccines. Typical entries: "measles thick in Bedford", "mumps all over town" and he sadly reported on Sept. 04 that his daughter's illness was typhoid fever. The doctor was at the house each day, sometimes twice. Accidents were common, both at home and work. "Lady in red house was burned, taken to hospital in ambulance" Workplace mishaps were often fatal. A few labor problems-on Oct. 17, a team of workers on the crusher quit because they were not happy working 9 hours each day and "they were quickly replaced by a team happy for the work".

Least written about but noted each week were the times they gathered with family and friends for a purely social occasion. Almost every Sunday they shared dinner or met for a few hands of cards.

Weather, work, sickness, fellowship; our lives are different today only in how we deal with these daily occurrences.

## The Genealogy of Two Soldiers

Helen Batko and Helen Pratt, with help from long-distance member, Susan Potter, researched the genealogy of Milo Barnum and Safford Grant who both served in the Union forces during the Civil War. Their genealogy charts are on display with supportive materials for visitors to see. Barnum was distantly related to PT Barnum, the entrepreneur. Grant was a distant cousin of U.S. Grant. These two Bedford soldiers were part of 208 local men who served in the Union Army.

### Masonry Restoration Update

Work started in early May and continued to the end of June. High power lines near the west side resulted in a work stoppage. City Manager Hank De Angelo interceded on our behalf to negotiate with the electric company. They will move the lines permanently this fall and work will be completed. This allows us to continue to raise the last of the funds.
